#### What is an atlatl?

Atlatis are ancient weapons that preceded the bow and arrow in most parts of the world and are one of the first mechanical inventions. An atlatl is essentially a stick with a handle on one end and a hook or socket that engages a light spear or "dart" on the other. The flipping motion of the atlatl propels a light spear much faster and farther than it could be thrown by hand alone.

The word atlatl (pronounced atlatal or atal-atal) comes from the Nahuatl language of the Aztec.






